am constantly being asked about the state of the organ world. Is it really dying? Is there hope? Is it becoming extinct?

The answer is no, yes, and no. Far from it. In the last seven years there has been an increase in application numbers both at Curtis and Westminster Choir College of Rider U. Not only that, the level of playing seems to



get better and better. I can't help but believe these student applicants are the direct result of Pipe Organ Encounters we have all become familiar with. We have hosted two of these in Philadelphia. Many of you have served on the faculties of these summer camps either here or elsewhere and can vouch that they are worthwhile and motivating. Schedule problems prevent me from serving this summer at the Lehigh Valley POE, but I am delighted we will be helping to sponsor two students from Philadelphia. Elizabeth and Andrew Dierkes are the recipients of our scholarship assistance. and both are students of our own Dennis Elwell. Congratulations to these two talented young organists, and we look forward to hearing from them in the future!

Easter Rise, heart; the Lord is risen. Sing his praise without delays, who takes thee by the hand, that thou likewise with him may'st rise: That, as his death calcined thee to dust, His life may make thee gold, and much more. Just. Awake, my lute, and struggle for thy part with all thy art. The cross taught all wood to resound his name who bore the same. His stretched sinews taught all strings, what key is best to celebrate this most high day. Consort both heart and lute, and twist a song pleasant and long: Or since all music is but three parts vied, and multiplied: O let thy blessed Spirit bear a part, and make up our defects with his sweet art. – George Herbert

On March 1 the ELCA commemorated George Herbert, a poet, orator and priest. He was born April 3, 1953 in Wales and died March 1, 1633 in England. In his 39 years of life, he grew up without a father, who died when George was three; went to school at Cambridge; and then held positions there. George caught the attention of King James I and served in parliament for two years; became a priest in 1630; and was known for his pastoral care to his parishioners and providing food and clothing to those in need.

The poem "Easter" comes from his collection The Temple written in 1633. It is reported that on his deathbed he gave this collection to Nicholas Ferrar, telling him to publish the poems if he thought they might "turn to the advantage of any dejected poor soul", and otherwise burn them. It is interesting that Vaughan Williams used this poem and 2 others to write Five Mystical Songs when he himself was an agnostic.

As I write this, we are in the midst of Lent and have just had out first major snowfall, and it is extremely cold. When you read this, we will be going through one of most intensive times in the church year, Holy Week and Easter. Hopefully the snow will be gone and new life will be rising.

Take some time to read this part of the Herbert's Easter poem and listen to Vaughan William's setting. Allow our heart's to rise through the music that we share, that other hearts may rise and celebrate new life.




